

Get to know Northern Vermont!



Vermont is such a unique place! We have seasonal activities like maple syrup sugaring and pressing apples for cider. We have beautiful scenery like Caspian Lake and Nichols Ledge. We also have relatively extreme weather that tire chains can help with in the winter, and staying on top of the muddy ruts in the spring.

There's so much to do around here, and it's super helpful to have the inside scoop! Hardwick has a rich history in granite and agriculture and has been the focus as a leader in the agricultural revolution!



Local Books

Hardwick and the Hardwick area are the focus of these books! Both of these books can be found in the Treehouse, but grab a book and enjoy yourself at one of our little parks or near a hidden mural.

<u>The Town That Food Saved</u> by Ben Hewitt – "In The Town That Food Saved, Ben explores the contradictions inherent to producing high-end "artisanal" food products in a working class community. To better understand how a local food system might work, he spends time not only with the agripreneurs, but also with the region's numerous small-scale food producers, many of which have been quietly operating in the area for decades. The result is a delightfully inquisitive peek behind the curtain of the town that has been dubbed the "Silicon Valley of local food."

<u>Kingdom's Bounty</u> by Bethany Dunbar – "This guide to the wildest and woolliest parts of Vermont introduces the energetic, committed, ideas-a-popping people that are bringing the Kingdom into a new era of glory, with a starting philosophy of preserving a community's rural identity and lifestyle, green spaces, and rich food culture, with delicious dairy, fine cheeses, gourmet beers, syrups, honeys, and much more."

Local Nature

Vermont is dominantly forest, and there are so many beautiful surprises in our forests. You are likely to come across various critters during

your stay - anything from fairly large spiders (most likely - they love the water) to bears and moose (less likely). You may come across our resident chipmunk, and will often hear owls and loons at night. Nature and spiders and insects are part of the package here!





When you go for a hike, please make sure to stay on the trail (especially at the treehouse – there are very delicate woodland plants.) Woodland plants are protected – please avoid walking on them and definitely don't pick any flowers or dig up any plants.

Also, please always make sure to bring any trash out that you've brought in when you're hiking or boating or biking. We all need to work together!

There's a new book called <u>Wetland</u>, <u>Woodland</u>, <u>Wildland</u> that is a guide to the natural communities of Vermont you could pick up at the Galaxy Bookstore in town. There are also multiple wildlife guides in the book selection in the treehouse.

- <u>Willey's Store</u>, Greensboro, VT Located in Greensboro, you will find literally anything you need here! They have local food and beverages, regular groceries, hardware, housewares, clothing and shoes. This is a sight in itself and seems to go on forever!
- <u>Hardwick Farmers' Market</u>, Hardwick, VT Fridays from 3-6pm, June-September and sometimes into October. - <u>**Tops Market</u>**, **Hardwick**, **VT** more like your typical grocery store. Not much else to say ☺</u>
- Hardwick Village Market, Hardwick, VT a more typical grocery store, but locally(ish) owned.
- Jasper Hill Cheese, Greensboro, VT they don't have a visitor's area yet, but that's in the works at the Yellow Barn Project in



- Hardwick. You can't visit the site, but you drive by them on your way to Hill Farmstead and can see the beautiful, painted barn. Amazing, internationally acclaimed cheeses - you can find at Willey's Store in Greensboro or the Buffalo Mountain Co-op in Hardwick.
- **Dolly Grey Orchard**, **Hardwick**, **VT** my neighbors, just around the corner! Apples and raspberries, when they're in season.
- **Burtt's Apple Orchard**, **Cabot**, **VT** Many varieties of apples, plus pears and tart cherries, and a nice farm stand. You can also launch rotten apples from the slingshot!

- <u>Craftsbury Chamber Players</u>, Craftsbury & Hardwick, VT Another world-class act in our backyard, the Craftsbury Chamber Players hold multiple performances at the Hardwick Town House throughout the summer.
- Grass Roots Art and Community Effort (GRACE), Hardwick, VT art classes and gallery in a beautiful old firehouse.

Bread & Puppet Theater & Museum, Glover, VT – around since the 1960's and famous for progressive political and social commentary, the art and puppets have a very folk-art feel to it. 

• <u>Hardwick Trails</u>, Hardwick, VT – no rentals here – you need to bring your own – but groomed and local!



A Bit Further North...

• Jay Peak Resort, Jay, VT - Some of the best skiing in Vermont if the conditions are right. There's also a water park and other activities. About an hour away.

A Bit South...

• **<u>Sugarbush Resort</u>**, Waitsfield, VT – Also some great skiing about an hour and a half away.

Head West...

- **<u>Stowe Mountain Resort</u>**, **Stowe**, **VT** We're in the epicenter of some great skiing, also an hour away.
- Smuggler's Notch Resort, Jeffersonville, VT More low key, a local's favorite!

And East...

• Burke Mountain, Burke, VT – More reasonably priced and a sweet local spot.

Other Outdoor Adventure - Biking, Snowmobiling, Dog Sledding, Etc.

Hardwick-Area

- <u>Atkins Field</u>, Hardwick, VT ice skating under the new pavilion, day or night! There are a few pairs of ice skates to borrow, but you're better off bringing your own. This is also the location of multiple community events, the farmers' market, community gardens, hiking trails, and a bicycle pump track.
- **VAST Snowmobile Trails**, **Vermont** there's a trail that goes right by the treehouse and you may hear snowmobiles go by here and there.

• <u>Mountain View Country Club</u>, Greensboro, VT – Mountain View Country Club is a hidden gem in the Northeast Kingdom (NEK) of Vermont. With its the nictures que gelf course (the eldest in its

(NEK) of Vermont. With its the picturesque golf course (the oldest in its original location in Vermont) and 7 red clay tennis courts, Mountain View offers a welcoming, family-friendly golf, tennis and social activities in beautiful Greensboro, Vermont on the shores of Caspian Lake.

- Newport City Dock, Newport, VT Nice spot to be on the water and there's a walking path right there. Also, some good food right there on the docks!
- Eden Ethical Dog Sledding Experience, Eden, VT local dog sledding tours!

A Bit South...

• <u>Woodbury Golf</u>, Woodbury, VT - This 9-hole par 3 course is no ordinary





Head West...

- Gentle Giants Sleigh Rides & Carriage Rides, Stowe, VT
- <u>Lamoille Valley Rail Trail</u>, Morrisville to Cambridge, VT a great rail trail along the Lamoille River, crossing the state from East to West. It's still being developed, but the parts that are ready are a real treat.
- <u>Morrisville Bike Share</u>, Morrisville, VT borrow a bike for free and hop on the Lamoille Valley Rail Trail!
- <u>Cricket Hill Trails</u>, Hyde Park, VT a nice, and free network of trails for biking, cross country skiing, walking, and snowshoeing.
- <u>Stowe Bike Path</u>, **Stowe**, **VT** a very popular bike path in Stowe. Nice and gentle, following the river.
- **Bootlegger Bikes**, Jeffersonville, VT Bike rentals for the Lamoille Valley Rail Trail.
- <u>Peace Pups Dog Sledding</u>, Elmore, VT local dog sledding tours!
- Pleasant Valley Horse-Drawn wagon and Sleigh Rides, Cambridge, VT Have never been here, but looks like a fun activity!

And East...

- NEK Adventures ATV & Snowmobile Tours, St. Johnsbury, VT I've never been here, but another fun activity!
- Kingdom Trails, Burke, VT world-class mountain biking, people travel from all over to use these trails!
- Lamoille Valley Rail Trail, West Danville to St. Johnsbury, VT a great rail trail along the Lamoille River, crossing the state from East to West. It's still being developed, but the parts that are ready are a real treat.
- <u>The Kingdom's Horse Drawn Wagon and Sleigh Rides</u>, Brownington Center, VT Have never been here, but looks like a fun activity!

Burlington-Area

- <u>The Causeway Bike Path</u>, **Colchester**, **VT** a bit out of the neighborhood in Colchester, but a very cool bike path that juts out into Lake Champlain. There's a bike ferry that can bring you through the gap in the causeway to Grand Isle, VT
- <u>Petracliffs</u>, Burlington, VT Indoor rock climbing wall.

Hiking, Swimming, & Kayaking



- Nichols Pond, Woodbury, VT Just up the road about a mile, even within hiking distance, Nichols Pond is a beautiful gem. There are no motorized boats allowed so take the kayaks down. Launch the kayak from the dam parking area for a relaxing float and great fishing, or cross over the dam and follow the path along the edge of the lake to find a quiet private place to swim. Keep an eye open for loons! To get there, take a right out of the driveway, in about 1/8 mile, go right where the road splits. Then continue for about a half mile and go right onto Nichols Dam road. This road looks like a private road, but it's not. Go down to the end and there's parking. Be aware, sometimes the road can be very rough and sometimes it's hard to find parking and the dam area can be a bit of a party spot.
- Nichols Ledge, Woodbury, VT to get to Nichols Ledge, go past

Nichols Dam road and go all the way to the top of the hill. There's a small parking area on your right at the top and the trail is right there. It's a relatively short, but steep hike – if you're in decent shape it will take you about 15 minutes. BUT, be aware that this trail is open only from August on because there are Peregrine Falcons nesting on the cliffs! The pictures you see in the link are mostly from the ledge. A truly beautiful spot!

- **Barr Hill**, **Greensboro**, **VT** a Nature Conservancy property about 20 minutes away, and the namesake of Barr Hill Gin, there are easy, short hikes with beautiful views.
- **Caspian Lake**, **Greensboro**, **VT** there's a public beach right across from Willey's a very popular place during the summer! There's also a boat launch right there. Also a big ice fishing spot in the winter!
- <u>Hardwick Trails</u>, Hardwick, VT Access is behind Hazen Union High School, there are trails of varying lengths for hiking and biking, periodic guided hikes, and the trails are groomed for cross country skiing and snowshoeing in the winter.
- <u>Hardwick Lake</u>, Hardwick, VT you can access the lake through Hardwick Trails, or park at the boat launch on Rt. 14. Beautiful paddle that's close-by.
- <u>Cheever's Falls</u>, Walden, VT beautiful, local waterfall you reach with a short hike.

A Bit Further North...

- <u>Crystal Lake State Park</u>, Barton, VT public beach, beautiful spot!
- Lake Willoughby, Westmore, VT Amazing lake with cliffs coming down from the surrounding mountains. The public beach is on the north end of the lake, and the nude beach is at the south end. There are also <u>hiking trails</u> in the area too.

A Bit South...

• Mad River, Bristol/Warren, VT – lots of really beautiful swimming spots on this river.



• <u>Moss Glen Falls</u>, **Granville**, **VT** – If you decide to come or go via Route 100 (which I highly recommend for its beauty – not the quick route, but the scenic route) you drive right by the second Moss Glen Falls in Vermont (the other one is in Stowe). A quick pull off and very short walk brings you to a beautiful waterfall.

Head West...

• <u>Elmore State Park</u>, Elmore, VT – enjoy some time on the beach, or hike up Mount Elmore – a challenging hike with a 360 degree view on the top from the fire tower.



- Moss Glen Falls, Stowe, VT a short hike off the road to a beautiful, big waterfall
- <u>Bingham Falls</u>, **Stowe**, **VT** on your way up the mountain road to Stowe Mountain Resort or Smuggler's Notch. Beautiful falls with an easyish/intermediate hike.
- <u>Smuggler's Notch</u>, Stowe & Jeffersonville, VT an absolutely beautiful drive through the Notch and some great hiking trails, including the Long Trail.
- <u>Sterling Gorge Falls</u>, Stowe, VT this may be closed because of a landslide, but if not, check it out!
- <u>Green River Reservoir State Park</u>, Hyde Park, VT beautiful lake with no motorized boats. There are loons and beautiful water.
- **<u>Prospect Rock</u>**, **Johnson**, **VT** one of the first places I went hiking in Vermont, it's a short hike from the parking area, following the Long Trail. Or you can hike from below, for a more challenging hike. Beautiful view from the cliffs. There's also rock

climbing for those who are inclined.

- <u>Journey's End</u>, Johnson, VT another of my first hikes in Vermont, short hike to a beautiful waterfall/swimming hole!
- Huntington Gorge, Richmond, VT Beautiful natural gorge, but be super careful if you decide to go in. It can be quite dangerous!

And East...

• **Devil's Hill**, **Peacham**, **VT** - another great relatively easy hike with a great view.

Burlington-Area

• **Burlington Bike Path**, **Burlington**, **VT** – lovely bike/walking path going along the Burlington waterfront.

- <u>The Open Space</u>, Hardwick, VT Yoga studio in Hardwick. My boyfriend's daughter, Sophia, teaches here!
- <u>Blue Heron Acupuncture</u>, Marshfield, VT My friend Christina does Acupuncture, Chinese Herbal Medicine, and Energy Healing.
- <u>Indigenous Roots</u>, Woodbury, VT My friend Sierra provides Reiki, Lightwork, Energy Integration Therapy, Soul Retrieval, Extraction Healing, Power Animal Retrieval, and more!

- Agape Hill Farm, Hardwick, VT Llama farm just down the road with gift shop, workshops, and llama walks, open from June 1 October 1.
- Fisher Covered Railroad Bridge, Hardwick/Wolcott, VT Historic railroad bridge, right on the side of the road on Rt. 15!
- <u>Crossroads Maple</u>, Greensboro/Hardwick, VT right on your way to Greensboro from Hardwick, swing by during sugaring season and you see steam coming from the cupola in the spring!
- <u>Hardwick Spring Festival & Parade</u>, Hardwick, VT annual event with lots of local flair. If you're here on Memorial Day weekend check it out! Or, at least be aware it may be difficult to get through town for a period that Saturday.

A Bit Further North...

- Old Stone House Museum, Brownington, VT History museum
- <u>Museum of Everyday Life</u>, **Glover**, **VT** Here's a place you could just drive by and not realize what you're missing out on! A fascinating little museum about everyday items, with a Bread & Puppet flair.
- Lavender Essentials of Vermont, Derby, VT I haven't been here yet, but it's high on my list! A beautiful lavender farm offering products and experiences.

A Bit South...

- <u>Bragg Farm Sugar House and Gift Shop</u>, East Montpelier, VT Try the Vermont classic, Sugar-on-Snow! The store is open year-round, but sugaring is only in the late winter/early spring.
- Morse Farm Maple Sugarworks, Montpelier, VT another great local sugar house
- Vermont State House, Montpelier, VT our beautiful state capital building!



- <u>Vermont History Museum</u>, Montpelier, VT if you're interested in history, this museum is worth the visit.
- <u>Vermont Institute of Natural Science (VINS)</u>, Queechee, VT Quite a bit further south, but if you're on your way in or out of the area, well worth the stop if you're interested in birds, but especially if you like treehouses, which I know you do! They have this new, amazing canopy walk that you need to check out! If you do go here, also check out Queechee Gorge, which you drive over to get to VINS from the highway.



Head West...

- **Ben & Jerry's Factory**, **Waterbury**, **VT** a Vermont staple! The tours are fun and there are samples at the end ☺
- <u>Cold Hollow Cider Mill</u>, Waterbury Center, VT you can't beat cider and cider donuts!
- Vermont Ski & Snowboard Museum, Stowe, VT an interesting history of skiing and snowboarding and many artifacts.
- <u>**Birds of Vermont Museum, Huntington, VT**</u> Sweet bird museum where all of the birds on display are carved from wood.
- <u>Old Round Church</u>, **Richmond**, **VT** Beautiful old round church built in the early 1800's.

And East...

- **<u>Rowell Sugarhouse</u>**, Walden, VT Gallery and shop not too far away
- <u>Cabot Creamery Visitor's</u> Center, Cabot, VT world famous cheese, just "around the corner".
- Fairbanks Museum and Planetarium, St. Johnsbury, VT many various artifacts, many stuffed animals from around the world, a rotating exhibit, and a planetarium. Also, a very beautiful building!
- Maple Grove Farms, St. Johnsbury, VT a rustic little maple museum and nice gift shop.
- **Dog Mountain and Stephen Huneck Gallery, St. Johnsbury, VT** very sweet little dog chapel that will get you teary for a loved dog that has passed. Also, a great gallery of iconic art from Stephen Huneck.
- <u>Great Vermont Corn Maze</u>, Danville, VT a fun, and challenging, seasonal opportunity the largest corn maze in New England!
- Montshire Museum of Science, Norwich, VT Nice science museum with lots of hands-on activities and options.

Burlington-Area

- <u>ECHO, Leahy Center for Lake Champlain Aquarium</u>, Burlington, VT I took my kids here regularly when they were little. A freshwater aquarium focusing on the local ecosystem, and a rotating exhibit.
- <u>Shelburne Farms</u>, Shelburne, VT great working and educational farm with a beautiful barn.
- <u>Shelburne Museum</u>, Shelburne, VT this was my kids' favorite place to go when they were young, but also lots of great things for adults great art and architecture and history.



- <u>Hotel Vermont Ice Bar</u>, Burlington, VT fun event, usually in February the depth of winter! Lots of local beverages, food and music. Make sure to dress warmly!
